In the former vision, our Lord made me really feel those torments, and that anguish of spirit, just as if I had been suffering them in the body there. I know not how it was, but I understood distinctly that it was a great mercy that our Lord would have me see with mine own eyes the very place from which His compassion saved me. I have listened to people speaking of these things, and I have at other times dwelt on the various torments of hell, though not often, because my soul made no progress by the way of fear; and I have read of the diverse tortures, and how the devils tear the flesh with red-hot pincers. But all is as nothing before this; it is a wholly different matter. In short, the one is a reality, the other a picture; and all burning here in this life is as nothing in comparison with the fire that is there." - St. Teresa of Avila

THE THIRD ARTICLE OF THE CREED

Who was conceived by the Holy Ghost, born of the Virgin Mary.

How many persons are there in Jesus Christ? There is only one Person in Christ, the Divine Person of God the Son.

The Strict Mystery of the Incarnation. - Hence we can say that Christ has a divine nature and that He is a Divine Person; we can also say that He has a human nature, but it would be heretical to say that He is a human person. It will be a help for us in endeavoring to understand what is meant by this union of the human and the divine natures in Christ, to remember that every man is of a mixed nature; that is, he has a body and soul, and so is party corporal and partly spiritual. He performs spiritual actions such as thinking and willing, and also corporal actions such as eating and walking. And yet a man is not two persons, but only one. The comparison, however, stops here, for man has not two natures, but only one composite nature; whereas in the Incarnation there are two distinct natures. The existence, then, of the two distinct natures in one Divine Person remains a strict mystery, and without revelation we should never know it to be possible.

<u>We Adore the Whole Christ</u>. – Because Christ is God He is to be adored, and we do not adore merely a portion of Christ but the *Whole Christ*, which includes *His human nature and His body*, which are inseparably united to His divinity. Since Christ's body is worthy of adoration, so also is *His Heart*, which is a part of His body and united also to the divinity. There is a special reason, too, why we should worship His Sacred Heart, for it is the symbol of His love for us.

The Merit of Christ's Actions. - Because

Christ's human actions are the actions of a Divine Person, they have infinite merit.

The Union of His Body and Soul to His Divinity. – The Divine Person after assuming human nature was never separated from it, so that even at the death of Christ His soul and His dead body still remained united to the divinity. And Christ the God-Man is living today in heaven, and will never cease to exist. It is a mistake to think of Christ existing in heaven as a spirit; He had now the same body which He had on earth and which He rose from the dead.

Who is the Mother of Jesus Christ? The Blessed Virgin Mary is the Mother of Jesus Christ.

Since Christ received only His human nature from Mary, why do we call her the Mother of God? Mary was the Mother of the Person Jesus Christ, and as He is a Divine Person and true God, she is rightly called the Mother of God.

Mary's Perfect Right to the Title of Mother of God. – As something of an explanation we may say that an ordinary mother does not generate the soul of her child which is created by God, and yet she is called the mother of the child, Somewhat similarly Mary, while not mother of the divine nature, is mother according to the human nature of the Divine Person who was born of her, and hence she is properly called the Mother of God.

<u>Nestorius and the Council of Ephesus</u>. – Nestorius, bishop of Constantinople, began to teach that there were two persons in Christ, and that Mary was not the Mother of God, but only the Mother of Christ. The Council of Ephesus (A.D. 431) condemned this heresy and solemnly declared Mary to be the Mother of God. The people of the city, to show their joy, formed a procession and illuminated their homes.

*** ON ETERNITY OF HELL ***

he most impressive thing which can be said of hell is that its pains are eternal and that, consequently, they will never have an end. This is a fact which forms part of the deposit of faith. It is stated clearly in Sacred Scripture and in the magisterium of the Church.

There is no escape from this inexorable truth.

Perhaps no one has found a better way of expressing, both dramatically and from the literary point of view, this terrible truth than the immortal genius of the *Divine Comedy*, Guided by Virgil, Dante arrives at the gates of hell and writes these words about what he saw on the door:

Through me the road to the city of desolation, through me the road to sorrows diuternal, through me the road among the lost creation.

Justice moved my great maker: God eternal wrought me; the power, and the unsearchably high wisdom, and the primal love supernal.

Nothing ere I was made was made to be save things eterne, and I eterne abide; lay down all hope, you that go in by me.

Let us explain, by the light of reason illuminated by faith, those arguments which make plain the convenience of the eternity of hell.(...) But in any case, let us remember that divine things do not depend on our criterion or on our human acceptance of them, but on his inscrutable designs, full of goodness and mercy, in spite of all appearance to the contrary. Man can, if he so will, give a Voltairian laugh and reject the truths of faith; but what he can never do, no matter how he multiplies his jokings and jibes, is to remove one jot of truth from what God has revealed. Heaven and earth shall pass away, but my word shall not pass away. And Christ has told us in the Gospel of the sentence which he will pronounce against the wicked at the day of judgement; this and no other: Depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire. God grant that those who now laugh at these truths may open their eyes in time, before they have to prove for themselves, in the eternal despair of hell, the truth and reality of them.

Theological reasoning tells us that the pains of hell cannot have an end except in the case of one of the three following hypotheses: 1. because the sinner repents and is restored to grace; 2. because God pardons him his sins without penance or repentance; 3. because God wipes the sinner out completely from existence. *** PLEASE, OBSERVE OUR DRESS CODE** *

For Men: A shirt and tie, with either suit coat, jacket or sweater, and dress shoes on Sundays and holy days of obligation. No earrings. **For Ladies:** A dress or skirt is required; no pants. The skirt must at least cover the knee, and should not be tight or otherwise revealing in any way. Immodest slits are forbidden. Clothing should be loose and not form-fitting. A head covering is also required. See-through blouses are forbidden, as well as clothing which is low-cut. **For Everyone:** No tennis shoes, sandals, denim, even on weekdays. The standards of Catholic modesty must be observed.
